new or migrated from a prior version, no legacy code. What am I missing? A:  
I finally was able to reproduce the error after a long time. It seems that  
somehow Xcode 11.4 and the "run on device" function weren't aligned. I  
migrated all my code to Xcode 10.3 and everything works perfectly. (I didn't  
even need to remove the application from the simulator.) Q: If this question is
